# **Chapter Awards/Recognition**

- For the 11th consecutive year, MSPRA was awarded Exemplary Chapter status by the National School Public Relations Association (NSPRA).
- For the third year in a row, MSPRA earned two NSPRA Mark of Distinction Awards; Collaboration and Year-Round Professional Development.
- Our Chapter was recognized nationally for our COVID-19 Toolkit work. As a result, NJSPRA invited two members, Ashley Kryscynski and Michelle Karpinski, to present at their Annual Conference in February.
- MSPRA member Tom Gould and MSPRA President Karen Heath presented at NSPRA's virtual National Seminar: You've Got This! How to Build a Successful Communication Program. They subsequently produced a 750-word article entitled "Tips to Build a Successful (and Respected) School Communication Program for the NSPRA Gold Standard Column to be published later this year.

#### **Resources and Relationships**

- The MSPRA Minute has now aligned with our member Facebook page for added engagement and updated information for members. MSPRA Board members have been highlighted through the Minute to offer a more personal connection with members across our state. We look forward to building on these features in the coming months!
- MSPRA continues to meet with state communication professionals to keep us informed and ready to serve the greater community when needed. State communicators joined MSPRA Board members in October and will do so again in June to keep our connection strong.
- MSPRA continues to collaborate with NSPRA to offer special membership opportunities and dual membership discounts.

#### Collaboration

During this year, MSPRA:

 Authored the Toolkit for Communicating about Returning to School during the Pandemic that was widely shared across our state and received national attention through NSPRA. Prior to its release, the Michigan Department of

- Education (MDE), the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS), the Michigan Association of Superintendents and Administrators (MASA) and the Michigan Association of Intermediate School Administrators (MAISA) reviewed the toolkit at MSPRA's request.
- Supported MASA around inquiries related to student count during the pandemic.
- Continued collaboration with the MDE Way of Work committee, offering expert communication support.

## **Professional Development**

- Just after school buildings closed in the spring of 2020 due to COVID-19, MSPRA came to the rescue to help school communicators with its first-ever Idea Hour focusing on "Celebrating End-of-the-Year Traditions" in a Non-traditional Time. The event was such a success that a second event was hosted on June 9 called "Back to School: The Key Questions You Need to Ask." These no-cost events spurred conversations and helped members reinvent traditional school experiences during a very uncertain time.
- On Wednesday, October 14, MSPRA offered at no cost, the virtual webinar "Growing Yourself -- Mindfulness and Growing in your Profession." The session provided information about MSPRA for members and featured members who have had success in part due to their involvement with MSPRA. Counselor and Restorative Practices Coach Gregorio Cognetto led the mindfulness session, offering our members a chance to breathe and focus on themselves.
- On November 19 and 20, MSPRA featured two virtual offerings: "Continuing Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Work" and "How to Produce Great Videos." Additionally, we provided our members with a post-election legislative update and structured opportunities to interact with each other. Survey evaluations found the sessions to be incredibly timely and valuable.
- On March 11 and 12 we are offering our first-ever virtual Annual Conference. We exceeded our registration goal and are looking forward to the conference evaluation results.
