Homeless Education Act McKinney-Vento

considered homeless if you are living:

- Doubled-up with relatives or friends because trailers.

- Attend school
- Stay in their school even if you must move.
- school records or other papers.
- Transportation to school, if feasible.
- receive.

Under the federal McKinney-Vento Act, you are

- In a shelter, motel, vehicle, or campground
- On the street, in abandoned buildings or
- you don't have a home of your own.

Your children have the right to:

- Immediately enroll in a new school without
- waiting for proof of residency, immunization,

- All the school services they are entitled to Attend preschool programs if offered.
- An advocate.
